## From the Principal......

Welcome to the 2012 School Year.

#### Year 12 Results for 2011

I am very pleased to report the outstanding results achieved by our Year 12 students last year. These results are the best we have achieved in a number of years. More students achieved A's and B's and significantly less students achieved D and E grades than in the last five years. We are very proud of our students and their teachers. Our students worked hard and our teachers showed the kind of dedication that really makes a difference. Thanks also to our families who supported our Year 12 students in their success.

Our students between them gained six hundred A and B grades, almost 64% of all of the grades our Year 12's achieved. This compares very favourably with the 59% A and B grades we received in 2010 and 2011. In addition we also had significantly less D and E grades. For example 8.8% were in the D and E band compared with 15% and 16% in previous years.

Our students gained eleven merits, or perfect scores, with thirty nine students achieving an ATAR (Australian Tertiary Admissions Rank) of over 90. An additional twenty eight students received an ATAR of over 80.

Amanda Li had the highest ATAR with a result of 99.2.

Although our Year 12 results are excellent, we are not satisfied with our Year 11 results. We gathered more than one hundred of our Year 11 students in Term 4, 2011 to gain their perspective. They provided us with a lot of very useful ideas about how to support their achievement and improve their experience.

I have allocated the task of increasing work completion and success for our Year 11's - and indeed all of our students - to three teachers this year. Their progress will be reported to you later in the year.

## **Unley High School culture**

In order to support student success the right school culture is imperative. Unley High School's culture must be orderly and settled so that people can focus on their work.

We will be maintaining our strong focus on uniform. Congratulations on the vast majority of students who have shown the self-discipline and organisation to be in correct uniform. Those who have not will bear the consequences of their choices. I do not wish to send anyone home as it will limit class time, however, students will be sent home to get changed if they are out of uniform with no valid explanation.

#### **Punctuality**

Perhaps the most crucial learning time in a lesson is the beginning.

Students who are late miss out on key routines and miss important information, including new concepts and work requirements. Lateness causes tension as it is frustrating, annoying, disruptive and time consuming. It causes a loss of instructional time for everyone. Habitual lateness shows a lack of respect for a student's teachers, other students and themselves.

We expect students to be at lessons on time. Teachers will be making their expectations and consequences for lateness very clear. Emphasis on this important precondition will benefit everyone in our school.

You will notice that we are beginning the school day with lesson one. Home Group will now be after recess each day. Please ensure that students are organised in the morning and are at school in time to start lesson one promptly.

## Materials and Services Charges 2012

The Materials and Services charge for 2012 has been formally approved by the Principal as a 'prescribed sum' in accordance with DECD requirements. A polling process was conducted in Term 4 2011 and of the parents who responded to the Poll 89% voted in favor of the fee being legally recoverable. The charge is \$665 plus appropriate subject levies.

Invoices have been issued and are now due and payable. Subject charges for Semester 2 will be invoiced later in the year and will become part of the 'prescribed sum'.

Some Year 12 charges may also include claimable components.

# Student Absence from school

Unless a student is suffering from an illness, it is the expectation of DECD (Department for Education and Child Development) that all young people attend school. The only exception is where a student has time away from school for the purposes of attending TAFE, or commencing an Apprenticeship or a Traineeship.

Families wishing to take their student/s out of school for reasons other than illness, eg family holidays, travel overseas etc., are required to apply for approval for such absence as set out below.

# **Application for Exemption from School Attendance and Education Participation** (for all students under 17 years)

It is a DECD requirement for any student who is not attending school to complete an **Application for Exemption from School** form.

Forms are available from Student Services or DECD website at www.decd.sa.gov.au

### LESS THAN ONE MONTH

Application is approved by the Principal and does not need to be lodged with DECD.

Students in Yrs 11 & 12 must also supply a plan from their teachers outlining how missed work will be caught up/completed. This plan must accompany the Exemption

## **MORE THAN ONE MONTH**

Application is recommended by the Principal, then MUST be lodged with DECD for Departmental approval. The DECD approval must be received by the school PRIOR to the start of the absence.

(please allow several weeks for this process)

It is an UHS requirement that the application must be accompanied by a letter from a parent/caregiver outlining the purpose of the absence. (A photocopy of a parent/caregiver note

All students must supply a plan from their teachers outlining how missed work will be caught up/completed during the absence. This plan must accompany the Exemption Form.

Note \* 16 year old students do not require an exemption to participate in vocational training such as TAFE, Apprenticeships or Traineeships, but MUST complete a FORM B Application for Conditional Exemption From School Attendance and Education Participation form.
