Summary of Treasurer's Report

The cross curriculum school funding for the rowing club for 2010 is \$8,000 (the same as 2009).

The costs associated with the Torrens boathouse and the West Lakes boatshed will no longer appear in the Rowing Account which means a reduction in the club's annual fixed costs of around \$4,500.

Fundraising profit to date is \$11,511.50 with Term 4 fundraising events still to come.

So far in 2010 ASF Donations totalling \$3730.00 have been made to the UHS rowing club capital development plan however these have not yet been received by the club through the grant process. This money must be used to purchase equipment when the club receives it.

A new petty cash reporting system is now in place which will see all income and expenses more accurately recorded in the School Rowing Account.

The club continues to pay its way with the funds available (from fees, fundraising and UHS support) however unless there is a significant increase in fundraising, fees or school support, purchasing major pieces of equipment i.e. boats, will remain difficult.

Further club discussion will be required to plan how the club can upgrade its aging fleet given boats cost between \$20,000 and \$35,000.

Rowing Manager's Report - 2009/2010 Season

2009/2010 has been another busy season for the Unley High School Rowing Club. Trainings, regattas, camps, fundraising, boat maintenance and social events have indeed provided variety and the occasion for socialising for both rowers and parents.

The season proper kicked off with the 2009 Spring Camp at Walker Flat. The technique and fitness sessions coupled with ideal weather conditions enabled all crews to progress in readiness for the start of the scheduled regattas. With improvement in time and the ability to work as a crew the main priorities, all squads/crews experienced some success. The Summer Camp in January 2010 provided another opportunity for the honing of skills in expectation of strong competition from all participating schools. It also facilitated the opportunity for more than 20 new Year 8 boys and girls to commence their orientation to rowing. Apart from some hot weather, their training during Term 1 was interrupted much less than Year 8 crews of previous years as blue-green algae did not close the Torrens at all during February and March. On Qualifying and Head of the River day, Unley boated fourteen crews. Our most competitive crews over these two days were the Year 9A boys, Year 9B boys and Year 10A boys, however all crews raced faster than their previous best efforts, so are to be congratulated on their performances. Once again the presence of many prefects, students, staff and ex-Unley rowers at the Head of the River created a great atmosphere on the beach at West Lakes.

2010, Unley's Centenary Year, has provided several forums for Unley's rowing history and

exploits to be publicly voiced and acknowledged. Anna Tree (along with Julia Gillard) was selected to be one of the key speakers at the Centenary Launch in February. Anna, a former Australian medallist at World Junior Championships, and current AIS and highly successful coach to Australian crews, spoke of Unley's win in the inaugural Schoolgirl's 1st VIII event at the National Championships in 1992. Her entertaining and articulate account of the obstacles faced by her crew and the ecstasy associated with the win was indeed inspiring as she captured the attention of the 800+ attendees.

Robyn Grey-Gardiner rowed for Unley High School from 1978 to 1981 and was selected to represent Australia at the Los Angeles Olympics in 1984 in the inaugural Women's VIII event and in so doing won a bronze medal. She also represented Australia at the Commonwealth Games in 1986, winning a gold and silver medal. Robyn, currently living in Alice Springs, willingly agreed to be our guest speaker at the HOR Dinner. A wooden boat named in her honour was the centrepiece in the George Cresswell Hall on the evening. In her speech, Robyn briefly outlined her rowing journey with mention of the high points and lower moments. But it was her personal account of the reasons why we need to acknowledge our roots that captured and stirred the rowers', coaches' and parents' attention. In acknowledgement of the school centenary and a personal desire to reconnect with UHS, Robyn presented the school with her Olympic participation certificate, a most generous gesture. This will be framed and displayed in the main school foyer.

Rowing again featured at the Centenary Gala Dinner. Several former rowers, coaches and managers from the 1980s travelled considerable distances to attend. The video presentation featured many photos associated with rowing, as well as a video of an eight, christened by and named after the eminent UHS Old Scholar, Sir Mark Oliphant. Also, whilst being interviewed, one of the hosts for the evening, Nina May, a student in the 1980s and a former national news

presenter, was most adamant in recalling the most memorable moment in her 5-years at UHS to be the Schoolboys 1st VIII winning at the HOR in 1987. Such an euphoric occasion has yet to be repeated by a UHS Schoolboys 1st VIII but hopefully something that can be attained again in the not-too-distant future.

The Centenary Open Day provided another forum for the club to promote its achievements since its inception in 1978. Numerous photos, written reports, old shields and trophies, uniform changes and a roll call of all students that have rowed for UHS created interest from many old scholars. It is hoped that many of these 'old rowers' will choose to reconnect with the club again through attendance at the occasional regatta or at a fundraising function such as a Quiz Night. Anna Wishart, a current Year 11 rower, was selected to be a key speaker at the Centenary Principal's Assembly. Anna's committed connection to UHS rowing also incited her to ensure rowing got a mention in her speech. Although the sometime difficulty in beating the private schools rated a mention, her love of the sport was also most obvious.

I encourage all current rowers to recognise not only their own involvement with the club, but also the numerous unique qualities that they have gained from being involved in a sport that promotes fitness, teamwork, self-organisation, fun and connection.

The school has again supported the Club well from a financial and human resources viewpoint. However fundraising is still an essential requirement from its members. On the inception of the Unley Rowing Club, part of the club's philosophy was that the sport must be accessible to all students. Fundraising activities, such as barbeques at regattas and at other community venues, social evenings at the boathouse, a giant raffle and catering for school musical productions not only assist in the purchase of equipment but also supplement rowing fees. Thanks to the committee who have instigated, organised and participated in numerous opportunities for

fundraising activities for the benefit of our rowing community.

On behalf of the club I wish to sincerely thank:

- Sophie Tree-Davies, Head Coach, and her team of coaches we are greatly indebted to the untiring efforts put into this club by these wonderful people.
