
#### **Year 12 Formal**

#### **Online Learning**



Educated researchers know that there's more to using the internet than just doing a Google search and relying on Wikipedia and Google results. Unley High students are increasingly being referred to use online databases. We purchase quality information tools that are not freely available on the internet. A database that is of interest to the whole school is the Online Reference Generator (ORG).

Acknowledging sources used in research work is an established protocol that is universally used in all published research work. These sources are collated into a bibliography or reference list at the end of the work. At Unley High students are encouraged to use a range of quality resources and expected to submit a correctly formatted bibliography as part of their research. Preparing a good bibliography can be a difficult and time consuming task.

The ORG is a fantastic tool that accommodates Middle and Senior School Students. Students select their level, select the type of resource they have used, look at the rollover example which describes each element of the citation, enter details into the Harvard Online Referencing Generator, then copy and paste into their own bibliography in alphabetical order.

At school students find the ORG on the Library Intranet. At home, students can go to <a href="http://www.slasa.asn.au/org">http://www.slasa.asn.au/org</a> and then enter the password ben22. There is no username.

The ORG login via the UHS website will soon be available.

#### **Rowing Report**

#### **TERM 1 REGATTAS**

Term 1 has been a very busy but rewarding time for the UHS Rowing Club. Following a successful Summer Rowing Camp, which was held at the end of January at Walker Flat, all squads have been training hard in preparation for the finale of the rowing season – the Head of The River (HOR).

Some of the term's highlights include:

- The purchase of a new Boat Trailer to transport boats to and from regattas, the design of which allows for a more efficient loading and unloading.
- Participation at two regional regattas at Murray Bridge and Mannum. The latter was particularly successful with Unley High School leading the medal tally with eight crews receiving medals for winning their events, seven receiving second places and three third places.



Calina Schanze, an exchange-student from Germany, has
dominated all the single and double scull events that she
has participated in at regattas. This includes winning the
Women's 1st Grade, U19 and U17 single races at Murray
Bridge, the Schoolgirl Open Single Scull at the School's
State Championships as well as all Open Schoolgirl single
races conducted as part of the Schools' Super Series
regattas. The only single scull race that she did not win
was in the 1st Grade State Championships Women's
Single Scull race where she felt privileged to compete
against several Australian rowing representatives

• The club performed admirably at the State Championships with Unley rowers being part of seven winning crews – Austin Zilm teamed with a Pulteney Grammar School rower to win the U17 Men's Double Scull; Calina won the U17 Women's Single Scull and paired with a Torrens Rowing Club rower to win both the U17 and U19 Women's Double Scull events; a Year 10 crew consisting of Angas Santostefano, Austin Zilm, Nathan Spencer, Tom Edmonds and Isobel Hercus (cox) won the U17 Men's Coxed Quad Scull; and Jared Lundy coxed the Torrens crews who won the Open Men's Lightweight Eight and 3rd Grade Men's Coxed Four.



- Huge progress has being made by the twenty-eight new Year 8 rowers. Their commitment and enthusiasm has been truly admirable.
- The willingness of the majority of current rowers, despite their own rowing commitments, to assist at the Come'N'Try sessions for Year 7 students who are interested in attending Unley High School as part of the Year 8 Rowing Class in 2013. The interested rowers and parents have forwarded some great positive feedback regarding our rowers' passion for rowing and the friendliness, helpfulness and patience displayed during these sessions.
- Eighty-three rowers participating as part of twelve quads, a four and two eights at Head Of River on 31 March 2012.
- The extraordinary efforts of the club's coaches, committee and parent helpers to ensure the smooth running and success of the club.

#### **ROWING AUSTRALIA NATIONAL CHAMPIONSHIPS**

The venue for these National Championships was the recently established Champion Lakes which is situated 25km south of Perth's CBD. The extreme heat conditions of at least 38 degree temperatures for most days during the Championships proved to be extremely challenging for all attendees. The Unley High School rowers stayed at a nearby Department of Sport and Recreation Outdoor Education campsite with PAC and Walford rowers. This provided an outstanding opportunity for all three schools to see each other as not just competitors, but as great ambassadors for SA Rowing.

The thirteen Unley High School representatives included Angus Santostefano, Austin Zilm, Hugh Kinnane, Tom Edmonds, Nathan Spencer, Isobel Hercus, Hamish Straatman, Ben James, Michael Ingham, Michael Heliotis, Jared Lundy, Aaron Jones and Calina Schanze. All participants gave their all which ensured some great results for the school. These included:

- Schoolboys Coxed Quad Scull Angus Santostefano, Austin Zilm, Nathan Spencer, Tom Edmonds, Isobel Hercus (cox) qualified for the C Final which they won by some 30 seconds.
- Schoolboys Coxed Quad Scull Hamish Straatman, Ben James, Michael Ingham, Aaron Jones, Jared Lundy (cox) qualified for the A Final, finishing 6th overall which is a most commendable effort.
- U17 Girls Single Calina Schanze easily won the B Final with a quicker time than some of the A Final participants.
- U17 Boy's Double Scull Austin Zilm paired with a Pulteney rower to reach the semi-final stage.
- U17 Girl's Double Calina teamed with a rower from Torrens Rowing Club to win the A Final and thus be awarded the gold medal for this event at the 2012 Rowing Australia National Championships. This was an absolutely awesome result that generated great pride amongst all Unley High School participants.

Each event for the seven days of racing was accompanied by live commentary on loud speakers around the regatta venue. Unley's regular participation, support and past successes at National Championships level was acknowledged on a daily basis by the commentators.

Another bonus for the rowers was being part of an event whereby they competed on the same waters in races that immediately preceded or followed races that featured rowers vying for Australian representation at the 2012 Olympic Games in London. The elite rower's participation was definitely inspiring to all school-aged participants at the Championships.

A huge thank you to Head Coach, Becky Lannan and senior boy's coach, Delwyn McInnes and the many parents who travelled to Perth to assist all crew members.



#### **FUNDRAISING**

Apart from conducting BBQs at all West Lakes regattas and at the recent Year 8 Evening, the club has also assisted at the Adelaide Symphony Orchestra's presentation of Symphony Under The Stars on March 25 at Elder Park by acting as ushers for the event, selling raffle tickets / programs, distributing marketing materials and cleaning up during and after the performance. This fundraising effort will contribute toward the purchase of a new single scull shell for the club.

During the next two months, the club will continue its fundraising efforts with BBQs at the Life Be In It Gym at Unley High School, the selling of raffle tickets as part of the 2012 People's Choice Community Lottery and the sale of Entertainment Books – see advertisement in this Newsletter. A quiz night is also planned for Term 3. Please help support these Rowing Club's fundraising activities.

Following the Head of the River on 31 March 2012, all squads will take a two-month break from training, with the exception of Year 8s. One optional weekly session per week will be available to this cohort. This will enable students who would like to Come'N'Try this sport to see what is involved and also allow the rowers who commenced earlier this term to continue to work on their rowing technique.
