



### ***From the Principal.....***

#### **Trade Training Centre**

Unley High School has been successful in its bid for the funding of a Trade Training Centre. The \$1.495 Million will be used to construct an industry standard facility. We are uncertain of the timeline for the project but image that building would commence in 2014.

We have been running a Plumbing Pathway in our current facilities two days per week for the last two and a half years, training more than 135 students. Approximately 60 of these students come from Unley High School and the remaining 75 from schools and colleges in the surrounding areas. Most students have gained a Certificate I in Year 11 and this year we have our first Year 12 class where students are studying a part of a Certificate III. Five students from our current Year 12 class have already gained employment in the industry.

The new Centre will make it easier for students to learn the required skills and we envisage, with growth in demand, that the Centre will run most days of the week. In addition, our industry partner, the Plumbing Industry Association may for example, wish to offer industry training out of school hours in our new Centre.

I would particularly like to thank Mr Richard Whaites, Assistant Principal and Mr Toby Watts, Coordinator Technology Studies & VET for their hard work and persistence – this is the third time we have applied for the grant – and it was indeed third time lucky.

#### **Apple Distinguished Program 2012-2013**

On Tuesday morning we celebrated our Apple Distinguished Program status. The award has been given to us because of the quality of our Middle School iPad Program. We are one of 16 schools nationally and only three in South Australia to be recognised in this way.

The Middle School iPad Program has been operating since May 2012 and we have learnt a lot in that time. All staff have iPads, as do all Year 8 and 9 students. The iPads have been used to shape learning experiences so that students are fully engaged and achieve their potential. When we began the program we made it clear that it was developmental and staff and the students would learn together. Our learning has been supported by our 20 staff and 22 student iPad Coaches. These people have willingly shared their skills and knowledge, helped solve our problems and given their time generously.

While the iPad Coaches, staff and students have really supported our learning, it is Cherie Pickering, Assistant Principal Learning Technologies, who has led our transition to a truly 21st Century learning environment, ably sustained by Konrad Date, IT Manager, Marc Vallance and Michael O'Toole, IT Support. My sincere thanks to Cherie, and to all of the staff and students who have contributed to the success of our Middle School iPad Program.

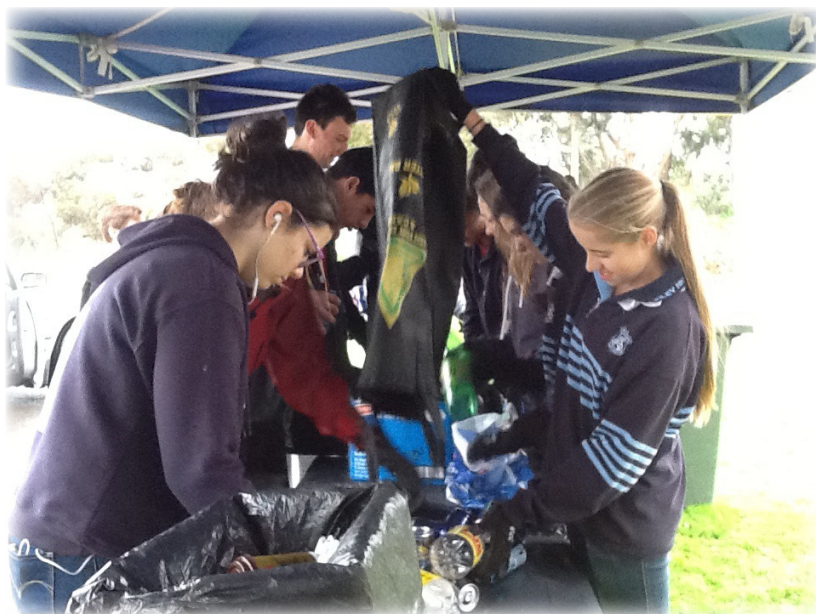
### **50,000 Bottles Fundraiser**
