



From the Principal.....

Welcome to the 2014 school year. I look forward to working together with you and school staff to provide your child/ren with quality teaching and learning and to ensure all students achieve to their highest potential.

On Tuesday 11 February 2014 I had the pleasure of attending the Merit Ceremony in the grounds of Government House. Students who had achieved at the highest level in the subjects they studied in 2013 were presented with their certificates by a range of South Australian dignitaries. This year Unley High School students gained more Merits than in the past five years

– 15 students between them gained 20 merits, up from the 17 gained last year. The 20 Merits were gained in 10 different subjects, attesting to the skill of students and teachers across a range of differing Learning Areas. We are very proud of our student's achievement. It is a testament to their hard work and perseverance and to the support they received from their teachers and families.

My particular congratulations go to Ann Jackson, who was our highest achiever, gaining an ATAR of 99.75. Congratulations also to Teagan Rayner who gained a Merit for the Research Project in 2012 as a Year 11 student, and then for Psychology in 2013. I commend her for her long term commitment to achievement.

Attendance

Attendance is the number one indicator of success at school. Students who attend regularly do better – they know what is expected of them academically and build better relationships with their teachers and peers. Students who miss more than 10 days at school annually put their success at risk.

Last year our attendance rate dropped from 92.8 to 91.7. While this is in line with state averages the decline is a concern. We have noted a significant increase in the number of families seeking an exemption from school attendance for their child for the purpose of family holidays during term time. This has contributed to the decrease in Unley High School's attendance rate. We ask that families think very carefully about removing their child from school unless it is for matters of urgent pressing necessity.

Punctuality

Perhaps the most crucial learning time in a lesson is the beginning. Students who are late miss out on key routines and miss important information, including new concepts and work requirements. Lateness causes tension as it is frustrating, annoying, disruptive and time consuming. It causes a loss of instructional time for everyone. Habitual lateness shows a lack of respect for a student's teachers, other students and themselves.

We expect students to be at lessons on time. Teachers will be making their expectations and consequences for lateness very clear. Emphasis on this important precondition will benefit everyone in our school.

Please ensure that students are organised in the morning and are at school in time to start lesson one promptly.

Kitchener House is named after Kitchener Street, the address of Unley High School since the 1960's.

KYRE (Yellow)

Kyre House is named after Kyre Avenue, the previous address of Unley High School before moving to Kitchener Street.

MILLS (Green)

Mills House is named after another previous teacher of Unley High School, May Mills. May Mills taught at Unley High School from 1920 to 1953 and was heavily involved in school sport. She was involved in developing womens sport across the state.

Materials and Services Charges 2014

The Materials and Service charge for 2014 has been formally approved by the Principal as a 'prescribed sum' in accordance with DECD requirements. A polling process was conducted in Term 4 2013 and of the parents who responded to the poll 85% voted in favour of the fee being legally recoverable.

The charge of \$665, plus any applicable subject charges, was set by the School Council and approved by the Principal on behalf of the Chief Executive DECD. Information regarding these charges has been previously issued to parents of 2013 enrolled students at the date of the poll. We were pleased to have been able to keep the fee at the same charge as 2013.

Incorporated within these fees are the essential components required to successfully complete the year at Unley High School. Included in the fee is access to equipment, textbooks, library, information technology, printing and use of consumables and resources for curriculum and some pastoral care activities which will be organised throughout the year.

Student Absence from school

It is the expectation of DECD (Department for Education and Child Development) that all young people attend school. The only exception is where a student is suffering from an illness or has time away from school for the purposes of attending TAFE, or commencing an Apprenticeship or a Traineeship.

If your child is absent from school, we ask that you ring Student Services to report the absence, or alternatively, email their Home Group Teacher. Teachers email addresses can be found on the School's website www.uhs.sa.edu.au

Similarly, students who are required to leave school early for necessary appointments must have a note outlining the details, which is signed by a Parent/Caregiver. This note should be presented to their Home Group Teacher for their signature.

It is an essential requirement for student safety that all students who leave school during the day report to Student Services to sign out.

If a signed note is not supplied, Student Services will contact a Parent/Caregiver before the student is permitted to leave the school grounds.

Students returning from an appointment must report to Student Services, sign in and then go directly to their class.

Families wishing to take their student/s out of school for reasons other than illness, eg family holidays, travel overseas etc., are required to apply for approval for such absence by completing an *Application for Exemption from School Attendance* form, well in advance of the commencement of the exemption. PARKING RESTRICTIONS AT SCHOOLS ARE FOR THE SAFETY OF YOUR CHILDREN

Local Councils impose a variety of parking restrictions at and near schools to achieve a safer environment for your children. These restrictions are also to optimise traffic movement and safety.

NO STOPPING ZONES -


These zones are usually adjacent to school entrances and the approach and departure sides of school crossings.

You must not stop your vehicle in a no stopping zone or on a solid yellow line, not even for a few seconds.



SPEED LIMITS -


Speeding vehicles in a school zone are highly dangerous for children. There is a **speed limit of 25 kph**, designated by the signs and a zigzag line below, any time when children are present or when the lights are flashing (depending on the type of crossing).



INTERSECTION OR T-INTERSECTION

(Restricted Area)

You cannot park within **10m** of the intersection.



NO PARKING ZONES -

You may stop in a No Parking zone to immediately pick up or set down your child, and drive off as soon as possible.

No Parking zones are to ensure a quick and smooth turnover of vehicles.

You must not leave your vehicle parked or unattended. If you are going to collect your child from this zone, have your child wait nearby in the school grounds so they can see you arrive. On your arrival they can then leave the school ground, enter your vehicle and you can then drive off.



CROSSING PLACES (driveways)

You may park so that the front of your vehicle is level with the approach or the back is level with the departure side of a driveway to any private or public property so that vehicles can enter and depart safely.

FOOTPATHS / NATURE STRIPS -

Parking is prohibited at all times. It creates dangerous situations for both pedestrians and other vehicles in the vicinity.

DOUBLE PARKING -

Creates dangerous situations anytime, however the danger is increased near schools, especially when children are entering or leaving school.

CONTINUOUS WHITE CENTRE LINE -

If a road has a continuous white centre line, there must be 3 metres between the vehicle and the white line.

SCHOOL CROSSINGS -

You cannot stop within **20m** of the approach side or **10m** of the departure side of a school crossing.

WHY ARE CHILDREN AT RISK?

- Their size means that sometimes they cannot easily see or be seen in traffic.
- Parked vehicles, light poles and other street furniture all block a child's view of the road and also make it difficult for drivers to see them.
- Their concentration is limited and they are easily distracted.
- Their actions are often spontaneous and unthinking (that's why they will dart out on to the road to fetch a ball or weave about when riding their bikes) without checking to see if vehicles or pedestrians are coming.
- Their sight is not fully developed, especially their ability to "scan" for things.
- They are lacking the ability to estimate the speed of vehicles, the gap between vehicles, where a vehicle is coming from or how far away it is.

Dear Parents and Caregivers

Please be mindful when dropping off or picking up students in front of the school. The following will assist traffic flow and student safety.

- Please endeavour to drop your children on the northern side of Kitchener Street but do not park on the northern side of Kitchener Street in the morning.
- Please don't do a U turn in front of the school in Kitchener Street as this blocks traffic. A round about is located at the east end of the oval which is a much safer alternative.
- Please don't drop your children off in the car parks as turning back onto Kitchener Street stops the flow of traffic.

We ask that you consider the large volume of traffic and students, particularly at the start of each school day.

DENTAL CARE FOR YOUR CHILDREN

It is important for children to have strong, healthy teeth and gums. All children (0 – 17 years) are welcome to attend School Dental Service clinics.

Dental treatment is free at School Dental Service clinics if:

- Family Tax Benefit Part A is paid for your child, or
- Your child is covered by a School Card, Health Care Card or Pensioner Concession Card.

The School Dental Service will bulk-bill under the new Medicare Child Dental Benefits Schedule that starts in 2014. Under this scheme, most children aged between 2-17 years will be eligible to claim up to \$1000 of Dental services over 2 years.

If your child already attends a SA Dental Service clinic, contact us when their next appointment is due. If your child does not already attend one of our clinics, please phone us to make an appointment.
